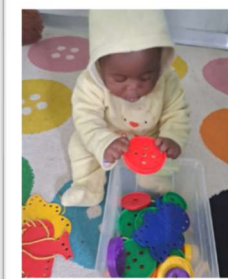



Vukukhanye

There are 36 children enrolled at the Vukukhanye Educare Centre, with numbers expected to increase steadily towards 50. The preschool is in its 15th year of operation, and we would like to commend our three teachers, Dineo, Winnie and Sibonisile, who have served at the school since it was founded in 2012. It's thanks to their dedication, fuelled by their love for the children, that the Vukukhanye Educare Centre is still making a difference in the lives of these preschoolers and their families.



The curriculum followed at the Vukukhanye Educare Centre is fully aligned with the Department of Basic Education's National Curriculum Framework. The low child to teacher ratio ensures that the teachers can address each child's unique developmental needs. The children are aged between 1 and 5 years old and divided into 3 age-groups. They are provided a nutritious breakfast, mid-morning snack and lunch daily.



Partnership with Saturn Pre-Primary

Vukukhanye is very grateful to Saturn Pre-Primary School, who will be making sandwiches on a weekly basis – Saturn children will bring bread and spreads from home. Classes will take turns making sandwiches at school, which will provide the morning snack for the children at the Vukukhanye Educare Centre one day of each week.



Assisting vulnerable families with food parcels.

Wherever possible, we try to support particularly vulnerable families with food parcels and other material support. This includes families of children enrolled at the preschool.

FUNDRAISING NEEDS (VUKUKHANYE EDUCARE CENTRE)

Need: Repair & replacement of 6 park-home units

The classrooms (3), kitchen, toilet and office units are prefabricated park homes. Four of the six units were donated 2nd-hand to Vukukhanye in 2012 and have reached the end of their usable life due to frame rust. The manufacturers have assessed and quoted on replacement & repair (detail below).

Benefit: Sustainability

The new units have a projected lifespan of over 25 years, which will greatly improve the long-term sustainability of the school and the physical environment for the children.

Budget:
